Ofsted commented:

The attendance of pupils has not been good enough but has improved this year as a result of concerted action by the school. While rates of attendance overall are broadly in line with the national average, too many pupils are persistently absent due to extended holidays taken

What we plan to do about this:

- We will continue our Policy of **NOT** authorising any holidays during term time.
- We will continue to notify Kirklees Council of any children missing education without a valid explanation from parents/carers.
- We will continue to work closely with parents/carers to ensure that every child attends school every day and on time. Late marks affect your child's percentage attendance, it compromises their education and when entering class after everyone else disrupts the other childrens' learning.
- Children who have good attendance (Government Expectation 96%) will continue to be rewarded.
- Bringing your child to school everyday is one of the most powerful ways you can prepare your child for success—both in school and in life.

Develop Childrens' Love of Reading

Ofsted commented:

- Pupils who join ... often speak little or no English and are unable to express themselves clearly or accurately.
- Pupils' overall achievement in reading is not as good as it is in mathematics and writing. ٠
- Ensure pupils acquire a wider vocabulary to develop their speaking and reading skills.
- Ensure pupils understand the content and subject matter of the books they are reading.
- Develop pupils' understanding of how authors use grammar and vocabulary to create effect.
- Promote a range of literature and high-quality texts in the library and classrooms.

What we plan to do about this:

- Train all staff to model effective language when supporting and delivering activities.
- Help pupils to understand unfamiliar vocabulary and appreciate an authors' work and style.
- To develop a new, well-resourced library in school, which will promote a love of reading for all children.
- Support parents/carers to read with their child daily and discuss what you have read. Visit the local library and put a limit on screen time.
